Continued to Develop PE and School Sport by joining the North East Lincolnshire School Sport Partnership (NELSSP) Increased participation in intra-school events. National school sports week continued for 4/5 weeks and competitions were held across Ormiston Academies Trust (OAT)- 100% of pupils were engaged at some or all of the competition.
