Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>At Ormiston Academy South Parade Academy, we promote a fully inclusive ethos where all pupils enjoy taking part in PE.</p> <p>PE equipment is audited annually, and new resources are purchased to support the teaching and learning of our PE curriculum.</p> <p>A wide range of indoor and outdoor equipment is accessible to all children.</p> <p>Activity levels at lunch time have increased through the range of resources and activities on offer. This includes activities delivered by our trained sports leaders.</p> <p>Award presentations take place during celebration assemblies.</p> <p>Pupils participate in a wide range of sports and develop the specific skills for each one.</p>

	<p>Inter and Intra competitions provide pupils with the opportunity to build important skills and qualities including motivation, determination, teamwork, resilience and good sportsmanship.</p>
<p>Impact on pupils' attainment:</p>	<p>CPD for staff ensures that the quality of PE teaching is to a high standard. Weekly PE sessions are taught following structured lesson plans with differentiated support and learning outcomes.</p> <p>The majority of pupils meet expectations for their year group and make at least the expected progress.</p>
<p>How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:</p>	<p>Sports Force Leadership training with School Sports Partnership has helped to train Y5 pupils to lead games and use the break time equipment most effectively.</p> <p>The majority of children in year 5 accessed Bikeability sessions and passed level 2 bikeability training.</p> <p>Around 58% of children leave KS2 having achieved the national curriculum requirements in swimming. Additionally, the children acquire important knowledge and life skills about being safe in and around water.</p> <p>Out of school sports clubs have run for a whole term. These included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - KS2 Cheerleading - KS2 Cross Country - KS2 Dodgeball <p>Cover for competitions. Pupils participation in competitions has risen due to staff and parent support</p> <p>96% of pupils taking part in the Daily Mile to increase physical activity.</p>
