Impact of premium use	
	At Ormiston Academy South Parade Academy, we promote a fully inclusive ethos where all pupils enjoy taking part in PE.
	PE equipment is audited annually, and new resources are purchased to support the teaching and learning of our PE curriculum.
	A wide range of indoor and outdoor equipment is accessible to all children.
Impact on pupils' participation:	Activity levels at lunch time have increased through the range of resources and activities on offer. This includes activities delivered by our trained Sports Ambassadors.
	Award presentations take place during celebration assemblies.
	Pupils participate in a wide range of sports and develop the specific skills for each one.
	Inter and Intra competitions provide pupils with the opportunity to build important skills and qualities including motivation, determination, teamwork, resilience and good sportsmanship.
Impact on pupils' attainment:	CPD for staff ensures that teaching and quality of PE sessions are to a high standard. Weekly PE sessions are taught following structure lesson plans with differentiated support and learning outcomes.
	The majority of pupils meet expectations for their year group and make at least the expected progress.
	Sports Force Leadership training with School Sports Partnership has helped to train Y5 pupils to lead games and use the break time equipment most effectively.
	The majority of children in year 5 accessed Bikeability sessions and passed level 2 bikeability training.
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	Around 58% of children leave KS2 having achieved the national curriculum requirements in swimming. Additionally, the children acquire important knowledge and life skills about being safe in and around water.
