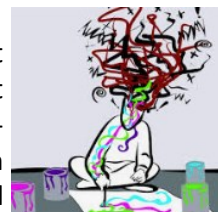

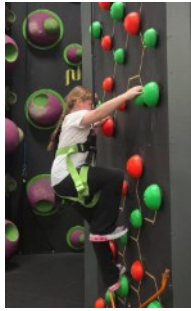
Fortis Art Session

cased their musical talents! As always, it was a pleasure for everyone to watch and join in the amazing atmosphere.



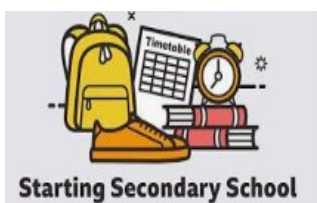
Lake District
