Better Together For SEND

The world of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (**SEND**) can be a minefield to navigate. **North East LincoInshire Parent Carer Forum** (**NELPCF**) aim to make things accessible and inclusive for all. We are a passionate group of parent carers of children with a range of needs and disabilities. We strive for positive change for children and young people aged 0-25, who have, or may have, **SEND**, and their families.



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NELPCF PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Each term we will be shining a spotlight onto a project that our **NELPCF** team are involved in. This term, we want to tell you all about **PINS**:



PINS stands for Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools. **NELPCF** has been involved in the **PINS** project since it started in February 2024. The project followed on from the Autism In Schools project, where 3 of our management committee met. **PINS** brings together health, education and parent carers to: shape **SEND** provision in mainstream primary schools; upskill school staff and strengthen partnerships between schools and parent carers. The schools that took part in the first year of the **PINS** project were: Coomb Briggs, Edward Heneage, Lisle Marsden and St. Joseph's. During the first year of the project the areas of focus were communication, inclusion, training and educational environment.

Our **NELPCF** representatives attended monthly Coffee Mornings/Afternoons to all four schools, along with training sessions and Prize Bingo events. So what was the impact for parent carers of the four schools?

- **NELPCF** continue to embed the work achieved with the four schools and parent carers, by holding regular Coffee Mornings in all four schools.
- Parent carers received training on SEND, coproduction and the Local Offer.
- 3 out of the 4 schools' parent carers created their own WhatsApp group to stay connected with each other

• Parent carers worked with the schools to write/amend the schools' SEND Information Report.

And what was the impact for the schools?

- Schools received 14 different training opportunities, including areas such as sensory processing, understanding of neurodivergent conditions, **SEND** and mental health, autism in females, lived experience of Cerebal Palsy, Makaton and visual aids.
- The training was accessed by teachers, cleaning staff, lunchtime supervisors, pastoral, admin staff, SENCos, leadership and teaching assistants.

The schools that are due to take part in the second year of PINS are: Bursar, Scartho Infants, Signhills Academy and St. Mary's. We can't wait to work with parent carers and school staff.

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MEET THE NELPCF TEAM

Hi Lisa! Can you tell us about yourself?

Hi, I'm **Lisa**. I'm 50. I have two adopted children and I'm married to **Courtney** who is also part of the **NELPCF** Management Committee.

What's your role in NELPCF?

I'm part of the Management Committee and I'm also the Chair.

When and why did you join NELPCF?

I first joined in June 2022. I went to the Carers Centre as I needed help. I didn't want to feel alone with my thoughts anymore and I

needed to find my tribe of parent carers that get it. They asked me if I wanted to start the Parent Carer Forum as we didn't have one. I went home to speak with my wife and she empowered me to do it. I soon met Leanne and Kirsty, and then Tony, and **NELPCF** was made from there. I know I was destined to join **NELPCF**. It has saved my sanity and I will be forever grateful that parent carers trust us and allow our team to be their voice. I love to stick the kettle on and give our parent carers a good listening to.

What are your passionate interests?

I enjoy creativity through art and mindfulness. I am also a very grateful member of **Al-Anon** (loved ones of alcoholics who meet to share experience, strength and hope) for the last 18 years. I support friends and families of alcoholics and drug misuse. This is where my saying **"keep it simple"** comes from.

What's a fun fact about yourself?

I love to dance and sing. I always try to have a dance off on a night out! And many more!

What would you like to see for the future of SEND provision in NE Lincs?

I would love for future **SEND** provision to be honest, equal and kind. Parent carers and young people must be central to all decisions made. Transparent communication is vital. Going forward this must happen. The Parent Carer Forum is about representation and this is what I have the gift to do, along with a tribe of superhuman Management Committee and representatives. Fetal Acohol Spectrum Disorder (**FASD**) is also something I will always wave the flag for. I am passionate for FASD to be mentioned as commonly as autism and ADHD. I want to reach out to parent carers, foster carers and adopters to say this is not a taboo subject. These children, babies, teenagers and adults are needing us to understand all they are. A pathway for diagnosis needs to be available closer to home as there isn't one here. So come along and join us and remember to keep it simple!
