Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>At Ormiston Academy South Parade Academy, we promote a fully inclusive ethos where all pupils enjoy taking part in PE.</p> <p>PE equipment is audited annually, and new resources are purchased to support the teaching and learning of our PE curriculum.</p> <p>A wide range of indoor and outdoor equipment is accessible to all children at breaktimes and lunches.</p> <p>Activity levels at lunch time have increased through the range of resources and activities on offer. This includes activities delivered by our trained Sports Ambassadors and Franklin College volunteers.</p>

	<p>Award presentations take place during celebration assemblies.</p> <p>Pupils participate in a wide range of sports and develop the specific skills needed for each one.</p> <p>Inter and Intra competitions provide pupils with the opportunity to build important skills and qualities including motivation, determination, teamwork, resilience and good sportsmanship.</p>
Impact on pupils' attainment:	<p>Termly staff CPD ensures that the teaching and learning of PE are maintained to a high standard.</p> <p>Weekly PE sessions are taught following structured lesson plans with differentiated support and learning outcomes.</p> <p>The majority of pupils meet expectations for their year group and make at least the expected progress.</p>
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	<p>Sports Force Leadership training with School Sports Partnership has helped to train Y5 pupils to lead games and use the break time equipment most effectively.</p> <p>80% of Year 5 pupils accessed Bikeability sessions and passed at least one of the qualifications.</p> <p>57% of children leave KS2 having achieved the national curriculum requirements in swimming. Additionally, the children acquire important knowledge and life skills about being safe in and around water.</p> <p>Out of school sports clubs have run for a whole term with some running throughout the whole year. <p>How the academy will sustain the improvements:</p>	<p>Continue to implement the new scheme of work in PE to deliver a wide range of sports and games in the curriculum, building on the previous skills pupils have acquired.</p> <p>Continue to work alongside Lincolnshire School Sports Partnership to access Sports Leader training and access to inter competitions.</p> <p>Continue to provide PE enrichment activities throughout the school year to raise the profile of Sport and PE.</p> <p>Continue to provide CPD opportunities for all staff, supporting them to provide differentiation in games, develop on the spot assessment techniques and adapt teaching accordingly to ensure all children make expected progress in the PE curriculum.</p> <p>Continue to work with Franklin College to extend our Sports offer to pupils.</p>
